## The Spirit of Cricket

The [Spirit of Cricket](#) is taken from the MCC Laws of Cricket and applies to MWJCA competitions.

Cricket owes much of its appeal and enjoyment to the fact that it should be played not only according to the Laws, but also within the Spirit of Cricket.

The major responsibility for ensuring fair play rests with the captains, but extends to all players, match officials and, especially in junior cricket, coaches, parent and spectators

Cricket is an exciting game that encourages leadership, friendship and teamwork, which brings together people from different nationalities, cultures and religions, especially when played within the Spirit of Cricket

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| <b>Respect</b> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Respect is central to the Spirit of Cricket</li><li>• Respect your captain, team-mates, opponents and the authority of the umpires</li><li>• Play hard and play fair</li><li>• Accept the umpire's decision</li><li>• Create a positive atmosphere by your own conduct, and encourage others to do likewise</li><li>• Show self-discipline, even when things go against you</li><li>• Congratulate the opposition on their successes, and enjoy those of your own team</li><li>• Thank the officials and your opposition at the end of the match, whatever the result</li></ul> |
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## Code of Conduct

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| <b>Background</b>                          | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• MWJCA have adopted the following Codes of Conduct for all its stakeholders</li> <li>• The codes ensure that participants develop good sporting behaviours and an inherently positive cricket experience, which encourages them to remain involved in cricket throughout their lives</li> <li>• The aim of the MWJCA competition is to give all participants, as much as possible, equal opportunity. Players of better than "average" ability are catered for by way of representative cricket, specialised coaching etc</li> <li>• All participants must take time to read the Code of Conduct. These codes of behaviour identify a selection of key principles upon which coaches, managers, umpires, scorers, spectators, parents and players should base their cricket involvement</li> <li>• MWJCA is concerned about bad sportsmanship, abuse and time wasting. The rules of the competition have been framed to endeavour to overcome these problems, and the Committee will view seriously, any attempts to circumvent these rules</li> <li>• Bad sportsmanship and abuse cannot be controlled by rules and regulations, and it must be the responsibility of Clubs and their individual teams to maintain a satisfactory level of discipline</li> <li>• Reporting of behaviour not in line with the Code of Conduct, unpleasant behaviour or poor sportsmanship should be reported via your Team Manager to your Club. The Club should then raise this with the Club of the opposition team to seek resolution, and/or report the matter to the MWJCA.</li> <li>• The MWJCA may then convene a judiciary for the purpose of investigating the alleged behaviours. Should a team, individual or Club be found guilty of an offence, the MWJCA will use the <a href="#">Cricket NSW Code of Conduct Procedures</a> as a guide for subsequent disciplinary action including, but not limited to, warnings, suspensions or loss of competition or club championship points</li> <li>• Any player that is suspended or fined (team points loss) by the MWJCA will be ineligible for individual MWJCA awards for the season within which the suspension or fine occurred</li> <li>• Should a parent be suspended by the MWJCA this will not initially impact the eligibility of their child, or their child's team for individual awards. The MWJCA reserves the right to reconsider this position based on both severity of offence and repetition of behavior</li> </ul> |
| <b>Players</b>                             | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Participate for your own enjoyment and benefit, not just to please parents, managers, or coaches</li> <li>• Play by the rules and within the Spirit of Cricket. Shake hands with your opposition and officials after the game</li> <li>• Never argue with an umpire. If you disagree, have your captain, coach or manager approach the umpire in an appropriate manner during a break or after the game</li> <li>• Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials and sledging other players, deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent are not acceptable or permitted behaviours in cricket or any sport. Abuse of equipment or displays of bad temper is not acceptable or permitted</li> <li>• Work equally hard for yourself and your teammates. Your team's performance will benefit and so will you</li> <li>• Be a good sport. Applaud all good plays whether they are made by your team or the opposition</li> <li>• Treat all participants in cricket as you like to be treated. Do not bully or take advantage of another competitor</li> <li>• Cooperate with your coach, teammates and opponents. | <b>Coaches and Managers</b>  | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ensure you have a sound knowledge of the MWJCA local rules in this document which are made specifically for the MWJCA competition</li> <li>• Remember that young people participate for their enjoyment (not yours) and winning is only part of the fun</li> <li>• Never ridicule or yell at a young player for making a mistake or not coming first. Teach children that an honest effort is as important as victory, so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment</li> <li>• Be reasonable in your demands on players' time, energy and enthusiasm</li> <li>• Operate within the rules and Spirit of Cricket and teach your players to do the same</li> <li>• Ensure that the time players spend with you is a positive experience</li> <li>• Avoid overplaying the talented players – all young players need and deserve equal time, attention and opportunities</li> <li>• Ensure that equipment and facilities meet safety standards and are appropriate to the age and ability of all players</li> <li>• Display control and respect all those involved in cricket. This includes opponents, coaches, umpires, administrators, parents and spectators. Encourage players to do the same</li> <li>• Show concern and caution toward sick and injured players. Follow advice of a physician when determining whether injured players are ready to recommence training or competition</li> <li>• Any physical contact with a young person should be appropriate to the situation and necessary for the player's skill development</li> <li>• Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion</li> <li>• Coaches should obtain appropriate qualifications and keep up to date with the latest cricket coaching practices and principles of growth and development of young people</li> </ul> |
| <b>Umpires and Officials</b> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ensure you have a sound knowledge of the MWJCA local rules in this document which are made specifically for the MWJCA competition</li> <li>• Compliment and encourage all participants</li> <li>• Be consistent, objective and courteous when making decisions</li> <li>• Condemn unsporting behaviour and promote respect for all participants</li> <li>• Emphasise the spirit of the game rather than the errors</li> <li>• Encourage and promote rule changes which will make participation more enjoyable</li> <li>• Keep up to date with the latest available resources for umpiring and the principles of growth and development of young people</li> <li>• Be a good sport yourself - actions speak louder than words</li> <li>• Remember, you set an example and need to be a positive role model. | <b>Alcohol</b>               | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• At no time during any match played under MWJCA competition rules should any coach, manager, umpire, scorer, parent or guardian or other spectators associated with a game consume or be under the influence of alcohol. ## Competition Structure

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| <b>Age groups and Divisions</b> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The MWJCA shall use its best endeavours to observe the following guidelines in preparing the competition format each year</li> <li>• Each season typically allows for up to twenty weeks of matches, based on ground allocations from Northern Beaches Council</li> <li>• Stage 2/3 Boys age groups (Under 12 upwards) will usually commence on the second or third weekend in September depending on ground allocations</li> <li>• Stage 1/2 girl's competitions (Under 11/13/15) and Stage 1 boy's competitions (Under 10/11) will commence on the first Saturday after the October school holidays</li> <li>• A deadline for team nominations by member clubs will be set each year and be approximately 3 weeks prior to the season commencement date</li> <li>• Members clubs are to propose teams for Division 1 and 2 competitions based on team composition and previous seasons results</li> <li>• Member clubs are allowed to have only one team in a division 1 competition unless the previous seasons results show that more than one team should play division 1</li> <li>• MWJCA will work with member clubs to establish competitions so to avoid competitions with byes as much as possible</li> <li>• Boys' competitions will be organised in: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Under 10 Div 1 &amp; 2</li> <li>○ Under 11 Div 1 &amp; 2</li> <li>○ Under 12 Div 1 &amp; 2</li> <li>○ Under 13 Div 1 &amp; 2</li> <li>○ Under 14 Div 1 &amp; 2</li> <li>○ Under 16 Div 1 &amp; 2</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Girl's competitions will be organised in: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Under 11</li> <li>○ Under 13</li> <li>○ Under 15</li> </ul> </li> </ul> |

## Uniforms

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| <b>Requirements</b> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Matching cricket attire must always be worn by players – this includes club shirts, caps/hats and either club-coloured or white/cream cricket trousers or shorts</li> <li>• Clubs must seek approval from the MWJCA for any variation to previously approved Club shirt or trousers prior to the start of the season or use in matches</li> <li>• Fielders may wear Club hoodies or jumpers but should remove before bowling or batting</li> <li>• Whilst there may be some rare delays in players obtaining club shirts at the start of a season, it is expected that all players will be wearing club shirts after three rounds</li> <li>• MWJCA representative clothing (including caps/hats and clads) should not be worn</li> </ul> |
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## Working Together

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| <b>Principles</b> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• MWJCA expects opposing teams to work together using these playing conditions – including discussing how the likes of wides will be interpreted for the game to ensure consistency of application for both teams</li> <li>• The best interests, and safety of all players must remain at the forefront of all decisions</li> <li>• If issues arise during the game (injury, illness etc), then teams should bring these to the attention of the opposition and discussed as appropriate</li> <li>• Where disputes arise, the rules as written should be applied</li> </ul> |
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## Registration and Team Nominations

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| <b>Registration</b>                                                    | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Players must be registered (through Play HQ) with an MWJCA club, or be playing with an MWJCA club under an approved permit (through Play HQ), <u>no exceptions</u></li> <li>• Players must be assigned/registered to a specific (club) team</li> <li>• A boy may only play for one club in MWJCA competitions</li> <li>• A player may play other cricket (e.g. MWCA seniors) with a club different to MWJCA club that they are registered for, or permitted to as a junior</li> </ul>                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                          |
| <b>Age</b>                                                             | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A player's playing age is determined by their age as at 31<sup>st</sup> August annually</li> <li>• For example, if a player is 12 on 31<sup>st</sup> August, then their correct (minimum) age group is under 13</li> <li>• A player may not play in an age group lower than their correct age group without prior approval by the MWJCA. Member clubs must apply for dispensation in such situations for that season. | <b>Representative Players</b><br><br>(Cricket NSW Youth Championships) | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• MWJCA representative players are highly encouraged to play in Division One in an age group above their normal age group to build and challenge their technique and skills</li> <li>• Representative players (any association) should always be graded in Division 1 teams</li> <li>• A representative player may only play in Division 2 in exceptional circumstances, and only with the prior approval of the MWJCA. Member clubs must apply for dispensation in such situations for that season. Where such players receive approval, they will be ineligible for individual end-of-season MWJCA awards (Under 12 and older age groups)</li> <li>• If a player has played representative cricket (immediate prior season or the current season, including shadow squad), with MWJCA and wishes to change clubs, they can only do so with the prior approval of the MWJCA <u>before</u> registering with a new club. Member clubs must apply for dispensation in such situations with these circumstances only approved in limited and exceptional circumstances (e.g. where the prior club will not have Division 1 team). This to avoid "stacking" of teams through the recruitment strong players</li> <li>• Players that represent a junior association other than MWJCA, should play junior club cricket at the association they represent. Member clubs must apply for dispensation if a representative player from other associations is looking to play with an MWJCA club with these circumstances only approved in limited and exceptional circumstances</li> </ul> |
| <b>Girls in Boys' Competitions</b>                                     | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The MWJCA priority is for girls to play in, and support the MWJCA girls' competition</li> <li>• Girls cannot play in the MWJCA boys' competition without the prior approval of the MWJCA. ## Fill-In Players

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| <b>Application</b>                      | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A fill-in may only be used where a team is 'short' (due to illness, injury or other availability issue)</li> <li>• A team is 'short' where it has less players than what constitutes a full team, as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Stage 1 – 7 players</li> <li>○ Stage 2 – 9 players</li> <li>○ Stage 3 – 11 players</li> </ul> </li> <li>• A player may fill-in without dispensation where they: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ are from the same club,</li> <li>○ are in either a lower age group, or lower division in the same age group</li> </ul> </li> </ul>                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                           |
| <b>Playing Up - General</b>             | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Opportunities to fill-in should be shared around</li> <li>• A fill-in player can fill in for another team a maximum of 4 times</li> <li>• If a player plays up (age or division) in 5 or more games, they are considered (registered) in that Age/Division and the playing down restrictions apply.</li> <li>• Playing up includes games played in Premier cricket (any grade), Shires cricket (any grade), and Senior cricket (i.e. MWCA) 2<sup>nd</sup> grade or higher</li> <li>• A player may not play up an age group in a lower division from their normal age group (what they usually play), other than filling in as a fielder or wicketkeeper – e.g. a boy playing in U12 Div 1 may not play as a fill-in player in U13 Div 2</li> <li>• If a fill-in player does not bat or bowl, it does not count towards the maximum of 4 games</li> <li>• Clubs are responsible for ensuring that fill-in players are capable of playing the age group or division that they are filling in for</li> <li>• Where a player is a fill-in for a team in another stage to what they play (e.g. a Stage 1 under 11 player plays Stage 2 under 12 as a fill-in), then the relevant club must process a permit in Play HQ</li> </ul> |

| <b>Playing Down</b>                     | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A Division 1 player, may not fill in for a lower age group, or lower division than they are registered in, even if they are age qualified. For example; a 14/1 player (that is Under 13 age), may not fill in for a 13/1 or 13/2 team.</li> <li>• A Division 2 (non-representative) player can play down an age group, and in the same or higher division without dispensation, provided that they are age qualified to play in that age group. | <b>Points</b>           | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The following points are allocated in all competitions <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Win – 5 points</li> <li>○ Loss – 1 point</li> <li>○ Tie – 3 points</li> <li>○ Match Abandoned (e.g. a wash out) – 3 points</li> <li>○ Won on forfeit – 5 Points</li> <li>○ Loss on forfeit – 0 points</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Points for BYE <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ To calculate the points received for a bye, the total points received for the full season are divided by the maximum number of points a team may achieve, multiplied by one hundred.</li> <li>○ This percentage shall be applied to the maximum points available in a match.</li> <li>○ The final figure shall be awarded to the team's total for the bye.</li> <li>○ If all teams have the same number of byes in a competition, then byes are worth 0 points</li> <li>○ Example: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ A team plays 17 games with 1 bye</li> <li>❖ They score 65 points from a maximum of 90 points</li> <li>❖ <math>(65 / 90) \times 100 = 72\%</math></li> <li>❖ 5 points are possible for each game, therefore 72% of 10 = 7.2</li> <li>❖ Total points for the season are <math>65 + 7.2 = 72.2</math> points</li> </ul> </li> </ul> </li> </ul> |
